KEYNOTE SPEAKERS

Dr. Farokh Master

Dr. Farokh Master is a distinguished homœopathic physician and medical doctor who requires little introduction. In 1976 he left his studies in orthodox medicine to pursue a career in homœopathy and graduated from the Bombay Homeopathic Medical College, Mumbai, in December 1979 as Licentiate.

Then, in January 1980, he joined the college as a junior lecturer in the Department of Medicine and, at the same time, he also took the full time post (initially as a house physician and later on as an administrative medical officer) in the homœopathic hospital. Both posts were the first of their kind. Slowly Dr. Master started giving seminars all over India and became one of the popular teachers of the country. In 1986, Dr. Master was appointed as the professor in the Department of Medicine, at the age 29 years. In 1985, he first started teaching abroad, which he continues until today. In 1991, Dr. Master joined the MPK Homœopathic Medical College in Jaipur, Rajasthan, and completed his Doctor of Medicine in December 1994. He was the student with the highest graduation results and, at the same time, became India's first M.D. Homœopath. At present, Dr. Master is the first homœopath in the country to be selected by the Mumbai University (Medical University of Maharashtra, Nasik) to do his PhD in the subject of "Cancer & Homeopathy".

This prolific homœopathic writer, orator, teacher and physician has travelled to nearly 40 countries and we are delighted to welcome him to Australia in 2016.




They have an independent clinical practice in Mumbai and patients from all over the world come to consult with them. Since they work and teach together they have, after all these years of doing so, popularly earned themselves the title of the 'Dynamic Duo of Homœopathy'. And, because they simplify the most difficult concepts, they are considered to be teachers of homœopathy par excellence.

Their latest work on finding the co-relationship between animal remedies and minerals has paved the way and helped to explain questions on 'Whether a human being can need different remedies during his or her life time'. They are pioneers of this concept and have illustrated this systematically through their clinical cases. A glimpse of this has been published in their latest hand book titled Quick Book of Minerals & Animals.

They are closely associated with Dr. Rajan Sankaran and are an important part of the Bombay Group of Homœopaths. As such, they have contributed to the science of homœopathy with their research work on noble gases, imponderables and animal remedies. They actively give seminars and publish articles on advances in homœopathy all over the world.


